FUNDRAISING - United Arts operates in a fiscally conservative manner and prepares its budget on a forward-funding model, meaning funds raised during the annual campaign in one fiscal year are restricted to fund grants and operations in the following fiscal year. This may result in net income or a deficit depending on the timing of when funds are raised and expended. The forward-funding model ensures the agency has the committed funds on hand each year to fund the grants and operations proposed in its annual budget. United Arts actively raises funds for itself and the region's arts and cultural organizations through its annual collaborative fundraising campaign. United Arts coordinates the largest collaborative fundraising campaign in support of arts and culture in Central Florida. CON'T IN SCH O

INVESTING IN THE COMMUNITY - United Arts invests directly in the arts community through grants, collaborative fundraising and contract service opportunities. United Art's two core grant programs support arts, science and history organizations and individual artists throughout the four-county region through operating support and project grants. They are: 1) Operating Support Grants (OSG) provide stabilizing operating support for the region's arts and cultural organizations with full seasons of programming and operating budgets in excess of \$75,000. In FY19, \$1,495,000 in funding was awarded to 35 organizations. 2) Mini Grants - This program provides much needed funding for organizations with budgets of under \$75,000 or that do not provide a full season of programming, such as fairs and CON'T IN SCH O

United Arts supports more than 60 arts, science and history organizations by raising and distributing funds, securing and facilitating contracts for services including vital Pre-K to 12th grade educational programming, and by providing technical assistance, advocacy, administrative and advisory services. In FY19, United Arts provided more than \$5.1 million in funding through grants, designated giving and contract service opportunities. Through the 60+ organizations United Arts funds, Central Florida residents and visitors enjoyed 2,881,318 art, science and history experiences. K-12 student arts education experiences represent 36% of this number at 1,037,879 experiences.

LINE 4a - FIRST ACCOMPLISHMENT CON'T

Fifteen of the region's cornerstone arts and cultural organizations actively participate in raising unrestricted operating support for the arts community. Donations designated to one or more of these collaborating arts and cultural organizations during the collaborative campaign, which runs from February 1 - April 30 annually, are matched at 15% by United Arts. Donors also have the option to write in the name of any nonprofit arts and cultural organization they wish and include them in their campaign gift. The Organization also garners support through grants and contracts for service. In FY19, United Arts raised over \$6.7 million in support of arts and culture from all sources; \$2.3 million was designated directly to regional arts, science and history organizations. Over \$2.2 million in

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funding was raised during the collaborative campaign and an additional \$1.6 million was raised through contracts for services, sponsorships and events, grants and other gifts and in-kind donations.

LINE 4b - SECOND ACCOMPLISHMENT CON'T

festivals that celebrate and honor the region's diversity. In FY19, United Arts awarded \$39,300 in Mini Grant funding to 27 nonprofit arts and cultural organizations. 3) Diversity Grants - funded through a grant from Duke Energy, this program provides grants for arts and cultural programming that will appeal to a wide range of audiences and is reflective of the racially/ethnically diverse communities within the United Arts service area. In FY19, United Arts provided \$34,000 in funding to 8 organizations. This grant also provided underwriting for diverse students to explore careers in arts administration through paid internships at area arts organizations. Combined with other capacity building and incentive grant programs, United Arts awarded over \$1.8 million in grant funding in FY19. Combined with contract service opportunities, designated giving and matching funds, United Arts invested over \$5.1 million into the arts and cultural community in FY19.

LINE 4c - THIRD ACCOMPLISHMENT CON'T

museums of art, history and science. In FY19, 62 diverse cultural organizations - all of them funded by United Arts - provided 1,037,879 curriculum-based arts education experiences for students in grades K-12. United Arts' largest education contract is with Orange County Public Schools (OCPS) to provide curriculum-based arts education services for OCPS students in grades K-12 (contract amount - \$501,058). In FY19, this

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contract facilitated 102,645 K-12 curriculum-based arts education experiences. United Arts actively seeks grant opportunities to increase the breadth of arts education experiences each student will have and the number of students that are served each year. For FY19, United Arts received \$155,000 in grants specifically for arts education experiences throughout Lake, Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties, resulting in an additional 30,614 arts education experiences these students would not otherwise have had access to. In FY19, United Arts saw the completion of its second Career Pathways to the Arts back-of-house creative skills curriculum development program with the opening of Tohopekaliga High School (Toho) in August of 2019. Funded through a grant from the JP Morgan Chase Foundation, and in collaboration with Valencia College and the School District of Osceola County, funding allowed the planned STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) high school to add arts to the curriculum, making it a STEAM school. 611 students registered for the Career Pathways for the Arts program the first year with options to learn skills in digital audio, digital video, entertainment design and graphic design. Students can earn certifications in different skillsets as they go. 84 percent of students enrolled in the program said they plan to continue their training at the college level after graduation. The pilot Career Pathways to the Arts program was at Evans High School in Orlando (OCPS). Evans is now an Arts Magnet school.

 United Arts provides programming that raises awareness for the arts and provides a source of earned income for the arts and cultural organizations in the Central Florida region. Programs include Orlando Arts Magazine - A

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bi-monthly publication (six issues published per year, pass through readership rate of 450,000 annually) that acts as a reference and guide to arts and cultural happenings in the Central Florida region and to the individuals who make it happen. The magazine is also offered as a donor premium for contributions of \$50 or more.

Quarterly Rack Cards - information cards available at the Visitor's Centers at the Orlando International Airport provide visiting national and international tourists with information on the exciting arts and cultural happenings going on in Central Florida (25,000 quarterly/100,000 annually).

OrlandoAtPlay.com - an events website serving the seven-county Central Florida region. The site provides information on arts, science and history as well as dining, nature activities, farmers markets and public art. The site serves residents and visitors alike as a comprehensive site to go to when you are looking for something to do and provides the arts community with a central location to post information to share locally and nationally. In FY19, over 800 organizations posted 3,900+ events on the site; there are 200+ pieces of public art and 141 restaurants listed. In addition, site visitors can subscribe to a weekly e-newsletter (8,600 subscribers) that delivers information on upcoming events and free and discounted events to their inbox each week. In FY19, the site had 92,333 users who visited the site over 110,667 times and viewed 209,420 pages of arts and cultural events.

United ArtsCard - a donor premium for contributions of \$100 or more, the ArtsCard provides discounted admissions and classes for 24+ participating

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area art, science, and history organizations. Over 2,000 cards are distributed annually.

Grants Management Services - A fee-for-service program where United Arts lends its expertise in grants administration and management for other agencies wishing to provide grants to the arts and cultural community. In FY19, United Arts managed over \$5.4 million in Cultural Tourism, Cultural Facilities and Blockbuster grant awards for Orange County Arts and Cultural Affairs.

Capacity Building Programs - United Arts facilitates workshops and capacity building opportunities to assist arts and cultural organizations with operational, fiscal and governance challenges.
